Academicians are invited to deliver lectures on recent trends. Value added programs are conducted. IQAC suggestions are respected. Faculty supports university in framing curriculum of COC courses and university courses. Course outcomes and program outcomes are followed. Teaching load distribution, teaching plan and lesson plan are prepared. Coverage of syllabus is monitored by the Principal. Faculty performance is evaluated through appraisal forms. College tries to maintain equality between male and female students.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

College being located in Rural location being in the centre place between Dhule Amalner so Highway maximum students are taking interest to have college admission. College staff is always cordial Co-operates among students and stakeholders. Entire academic and admission information is displaced on website. The prospectus is available with information with rules and regulations. Government reservation policy is followed. Teaching plans are available in departments. College values always diverse needs of students. Teaching learning process is followed by socio-economical-geographical-cultural background of students. Slow and advance learners are identified through subject knowledge tests. Students are counseled and motivated personally. Students anchor in programmes at local seminars in the college. 4. Concerned departments and cells sensitize students towards social issues through their various activities. The main purpose of programs is to see the welfare of society. Lectures of eminent personalities are conducted on social cultural and and competitive examinations guidence issues to ensure holistic development of students.

NSS unit earnestly challenges students to inculcate national integration in the neighborhood society. Every year a village is selected in the vicinity and college organizes a seven days residential camp and organizes cleanliness campaign, village survey, awareness of soil and water conservatio, cash-less society, disaster-management, caste-less India, eradication of superstition, save energy, social health program, anti open deification, competitive examinations, laws awareness, *stri bhrun hatya*, and Beti bachao ,Beti padhav, tree plantation, etc. During last five years, we have organized camps in Karki and Ramgarh, a tribal village.

NSS unit built the "Vanrai Bandhara" in the area of Chopadai for water conservation for two years continuously in the special winter camp. The Bandhara has been useful to farmers due to the increase of water level. The cleanliness campaign carried out in the village has provided an aid to the health of the community. Students worked for the health checking camp of the cattle to uplift their health and this has been the subject of discussion in the community. Students have messaged of the National Integration through "Campus Cleanliness, Prohibition of Dowry, Prohibition of Alcohol, Save Girl Child, Environmental Awareness Programms, Beti Bachao-Beti Padhao rally", etc. for social awareness.
